

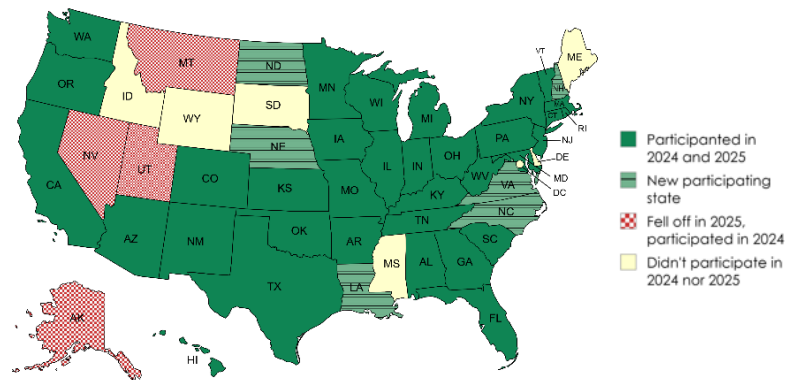


NATIONAL INJURY PREVENTION DAY 2025: 6TH ANNUAL NIPD SUMMARY REPORT

Growing Impact Nationwide

On November 18, 2020, the National Program Office of the Injury Free Coalition for Kids® launched the first [National Injury Prevention Day \(NIPD\)](#) in the United States to bring national attention to the burden of injury—the leading cause of death and hospitalizations for individuals ages 1–44 in the United States (WISQARS 2023). This social awareness campaign was modeled after Canadian National Injury Prevention Day led by Parachute - Canada’s national charity dedicated to Injury Prevention.

Since its inception, National Injury Prevention Day (NIPD) has mobilized communities, strengthened partnerships, and amplified awareness about the burden of unintentional and intentional injury across the United States. What began in 2020 with participation from 22 cities as an effort to continue to highlight the devastating effects of injuries and the need for injury prevention education throughout the pandemic has grown into a nationwide movement engaging diverse stakeholders and communities.



6th Annual National Injury Prevention Day: By the Numbers

On [National Injury Prevention Day \(NIPD\)](#) hospitals, **trauma centers**, and **safety organizations** across the United States host an array of events. Key activities include "**Shining a Green Light**" by illuminating buildings, landmarks, homes, and their own institutions in green. **Community education and staff education** covering prevention of a series of injury topics: car seat and passenger safety, firearm storage, older adult fall prevention, "Stop the Bleed" through safety fairs, tabling events, workshops, and trainings. Furthermore, local and state governments demonstrate their support by issuing official **proclamations** recognizing November 18th as National Injury Prevention Day (NIPD) and the

importance of injury prevention. Public outreach is further extended through **social media campaigns**, traditional media coverage, webinars, virtual training, and a media contest. **2025 Results:**

- 645 total activities (↑ 54% from 2024)
- 180 participating institutions
- 145 cities
- 40 states

Through education, advocacy, and community engagement, NIPD empowers individuals and organizations to take

meaningful action to prevent injuries and violence in their communities. The top 5 states with the most registered activities: New York State (99), Florida (54), Texas (42), Iowa (39), and Wisconsin (22).

Expanding Reach Through Strategic Partnerships

The message of NIPD continues to spread by building new partnerships and enhancing existing collaborations across healthcare systems, community organizations, government agencies, and corporate partners, among others. The continued expansion of participation, visibility, and educational outreach reflects both the urgency of the injury crisis and the power of coordinated national action.

Growth is fueled by collaboration. This year, we were proud to welcome the [National Road Safety Foundation \(NRSF\)](#) and the [National Fire Protection Association \(NFPA\)](#) as new partners.

In the newest initiative, [Injury Free Coalition for Kids](#) joined forces with [Safe Kids Worldwide](#) and the [Society for Violence and Injury Science \(SAVIR\)](#) to launch a "Brilliant Partnership" between partners in prevention.



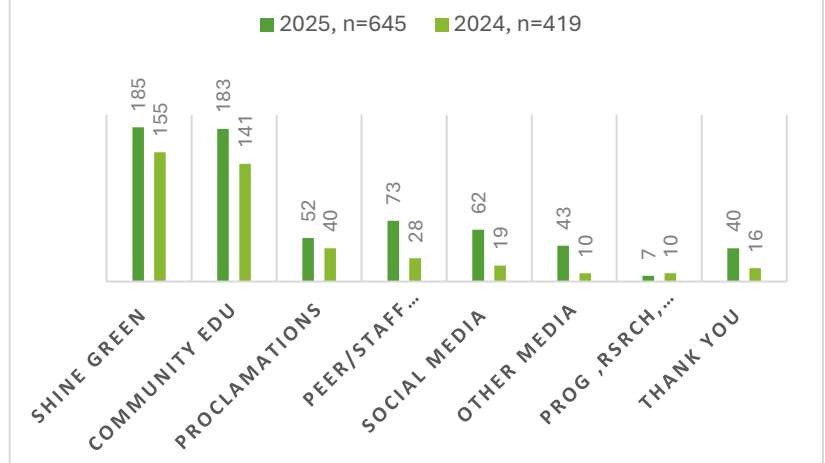
This initiative introduced [A YEAR of ACTION](#) campaign, designed to keep the momentum of NIPD alive every day of the year.

Kickoff Webinar: "Unifying Voices": Unifying Voices: Turning Awareness into Action, provided a dynamic, multi-perspective [Kickoff Webinar](#) focused on the power of advocacy and education in preventing injuries and saving lives. **Sue Prentiss** from the [American Trauma Society](#) moderated the discussion with a diverse expert panel who shared their unique insights and actionable strategies to build safer environments. Pediatric emergency medicine physician **Dr. Justin Assioun** discussed the dramatic increase in injuries from e-bikes and provided [safety education resources](#). **Joseph Colella** of [Baby Safety Alliance](#) emphasized the injury risk associated with switching children from rear facing to forward facing too soon. **Sharon Gilmartin** of [Safe States Alliance](#) discussed effective policy change in injury prevention. **Chezik Tsunoda**, parent advocate, film maker, and founder/CEO of [No More Under](#) talked about drowning prevention through community driven approaches and legislation. Over 250 people attended the kickoff event.

This [Post NIPD Fireside Chat](#) moderated by **Tracy Mehan** from the Center for Injury Research and Policy at [Nationwide Children's Hospital](#) led a conversation with **Mighty Fine (APHA)**, **Christen Rexing (SAVIR)** and **Torine Creppy (SKW)** who shared insights on turning awareness into sustained action, building stronger connections across sectors, and amplifying the collective impact of injury prevention work. Collectively they made a call to all public health organizations to increase collaboration and strengthen partnerships through a [year of Action](#) to continue the momentum.

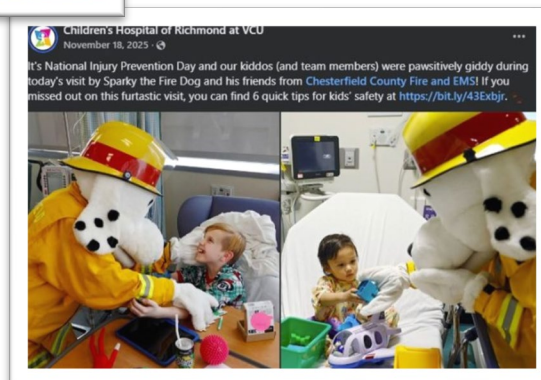
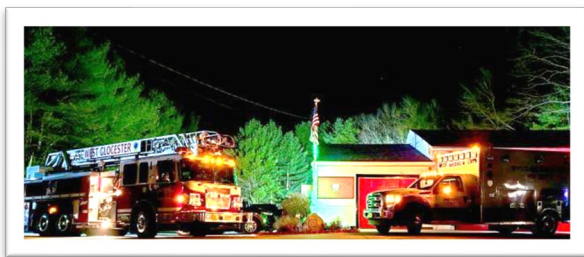
FALL PREVENTION

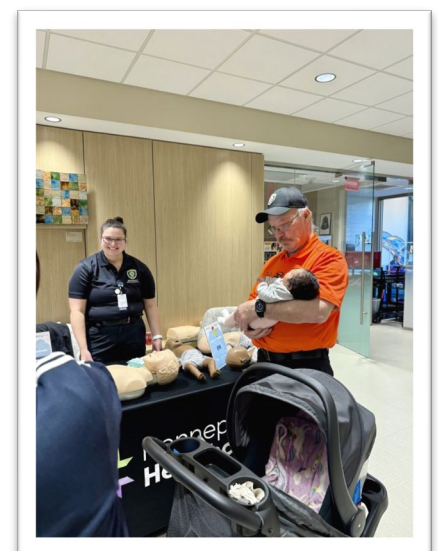

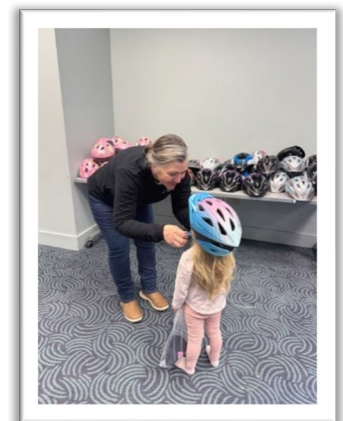

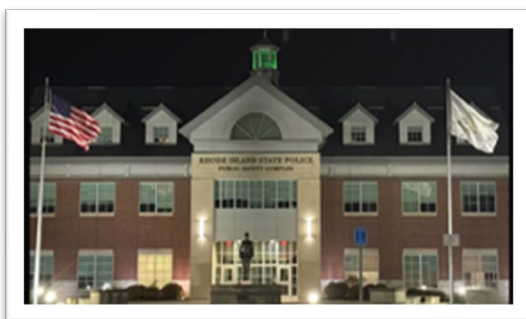
POISON PREVENTION

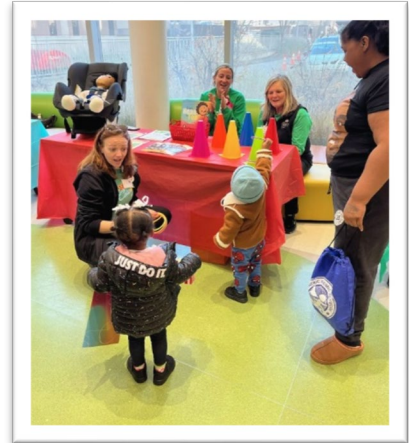

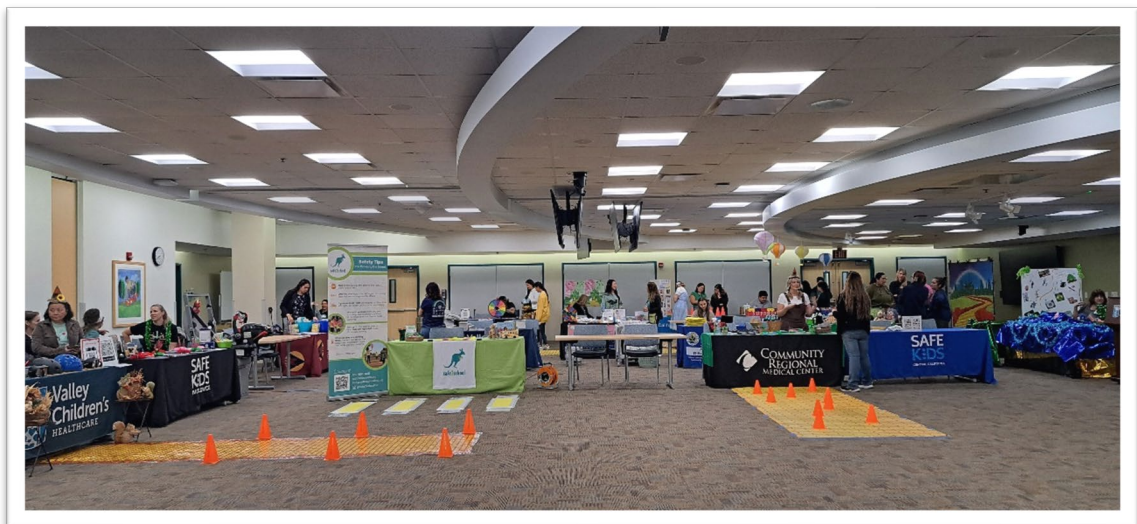


SAFETY FAIRS/CARNIVAL

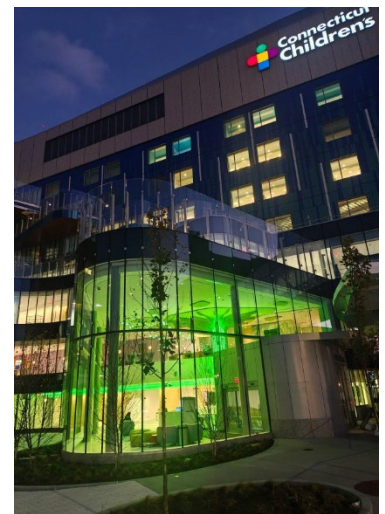


SAFETY SHOWER

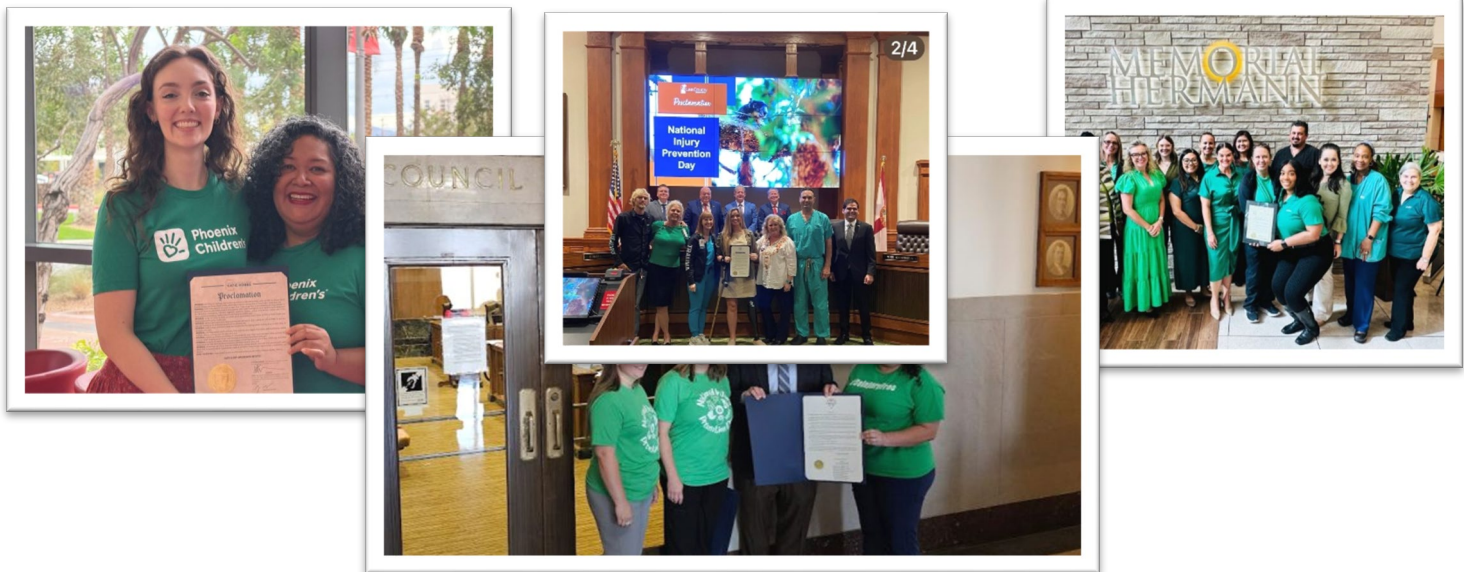
